#### School App for Phones

Our SCHOOL APP has gone live and can be downloaded for FREE ~ Kitchener PS App for mobile devices from either App store (Google play or iTunes -apps). This App is available for both Apple and Android devices, including phones, tablets and iPads. The App will send alerts/reminders, offer newsletters, absence notes, change of details and real time question responses as well as many other components. The Kitchener App will maximize the way in which the school can communicate with our community. To download our App, simply type Kitchener School into your app search and it will appear. Click install and, you're connected. (An information sheet is on the last page of this newsletter).

#### **Extreme Weather Conditions**

As we move into summer we are reminded of extreme conditions that can occur in our local area. *We ask all our parents to ensure that their contact details are up to date.* In the event of an evacuation or extreme weather warning, our emergency contact list is the school's main way of contact.

Also *please ensure your child/ren* has, and wears, their school hat and brings a drink bottle to school daily. We ask that all hats be clearly labeled and that students put their hats in their bags at the end of each break to limit lost items.
