Actively-Listening-Without-Comment

Actively listening-without-comment means directing all of your attention to your child whilst they talk to you. It requires looking at them plus motivation, concentration and attention on the listeners part. It means we keep our thoughts and opinions out of the process as much as we can so that we focus on the child's version of reality.



What does this mean?



When children express emotions like sadness or anger, they give you a chance to become their confidante, a chance to teach them that emotions are normal and that there are constructive ways to deal with negative feelings. Most of all, they keep confiding in you something we want to continue to foster and nurture during those adolescent years!

Putting it into Practice?

How Will this benefit my child?

Listening without judging

- Sometimes the problems that upset a child are, to adults, ridiculous. But, whether it's a monster in the wardrobe or the boy next door taking their pencils—the issues feel serious to a child.
- We need to suspend our adult perspective and consider the problem from a child's viewpoint, to enter their inner world and try to understand its intensity. When we say, "Don't be silly" or "Don't be sensitive", when we dismiss their concerns, the child feels as though their version of reality is irrelevant or unimportant.

Allowing them to talk it through

- When your child is upset, indulge them with uninterrupted talking time. Say little and prompt them—"Go on", "Uh huh" or be silent for them.
- It's difficult to avoid the temptation to interrupt or jump in with an instant solution, but your child needs to feel heard. Delay introducing your own experiences—"That reminds me of the time I..." and keep the focus on your child's problem:

Part Two, next issue, will focus on letting your child feel understood and concentrating on their feelings.
