Actively Listening Without Comment



PART 2

Christmas can bring mixed feelings for children and adults alike. This week's article will focus on letting others (adults and children) feel heard and understood whilst concentrating on their feelings.

Let others feel understood

When listening to your child talk to you, rather than asking them a string of questions, paraphrase what they've said to you using your own words without adding your own comments. For example:

Child: It was my ball, they wouldn't let me use it. I didn't get a turn at all.

Parent: So you didn't get to use your ball


Paraphrasing allows others to feel understood and free to continue with what they want to say rather than having to answer a question.



Concentrating on Feelings

Everyone has a right to their feelings no matter how intense however the focus is identifying the "feeling" and then managing it appropriately. The greater their vocabulary for feelings, the more they become capable of communicating negative emotions and diagnosing their own problems. To help children feel understood we can reflect their feelings back to them.

"It sounds like you are feeling......"



Identifying Feelings

We can use the following list of emotions to help our children find the right word to express how they're feeling.

At one time or another everyone needs to be "really" listened to and "heard". When we let another talk, when we reflect upon what they have said and focus on their feelings it leaves that person feeling understood and may just be what they need at that point in time.
