

# KITCHENER'S ROCKING READERS

#### TRANSPORT FOR NSW ~ SCHOOL OPAL CARD


The new School Student Opal Card system for school bus travel will commence from the beginning of next year (2016). All eligible students will be issued with Opal Cards.

Information packages have gone home a few weeks ago with students who will be in ~

#### Kindergarten, Year 3 and Year 7 next year.

Fact Sheet: Step 1 ~ Parents need to complete the application online ~ the packages contain all information. Step 2 ~ Once application is lodged, parent prints, signs and submits form to our school for endorsement.

Step 3 ~ we will then forward the application to the Transport of NSW Department. Once approved, Transport for NSW send the School Opal Card to the home address given on the application.



Students at our school who are currently in *Kindergarten, Year 1, Year 3, Year 4 or Year 5 this year* (in Year 1, Year 2, Year 4, Year 5 or Year 6 *next* year), who currently have a school bus pass, will receive a School Opal Card automatically early in the first term, next year (2016). *These will be sent directly to our school for distribution to the students.*

# Garden Update

#### What bugs are in your garden?

Students have been noticing all sorts of bugs and creepy crawlies in the school garden. Caterpillers, ladybugs, spiders, and even a frog! As gardeners we are excited to see these sorts of things because it means our garden is becoming a healthier ecosystem. Many of these creatures are beneficial to the garden. Bees and butterflies help with the pollination, worms help keep the soil healthy. Spiders and frogs both eat insects, ladybugs eat aphids.



Last week we found half a dozen orb-weaving spiders amongst the taller plants and we were able to watch as one spider caught a smaller insect.



Students also helped pick caterpillars and slugs out of the garden. The chooks enjoyed eating the slugs, but the students were keen to take the caterpillars home and see what they might turn into. The K/1 class looked after a cocoon for a few weeks, and Mrs Firth got a shock one morning to find a Cabbage Moth in the container!

#### Student Helpers

Every Wednesday during the lunch break students are able to visit the garden and help out. Jobs range from planting seeds to looking after the worms, sometimes even just weeding. Over the last few weeks the garden has enjoyed the help of students involved in the kindy orientation – we look forward to seeing more of them next year!




